


Reader's Response

Show me a long word in the story. Can you stretch it out?
Were you able to follow all the words in the story? Show me.
What strategy was most useful to you to figure out tricky words?

Text Level Questions

How does this story relate to something that has happened to you?
Who are the main characters in this story?
Where did the story take place?
Can you tell me the major events in the story?
What were the most important events or facts in the story?
The least important?
What do you think would happen next in the story if it continued?
What questions did you ask yourself while you were reading?
What was the book about?
How is the story like another book you have read?
Why did you choose this book?
What did you see in your mind while you were reading this book?

(Does the book remind you of something that has happened in your life? Does the book remind you of another book?)


Example: If the book was about a trip to the beach, I might write that I have looked for seashells on the beach just like the boy did in the story.
